1912 Sth STREET BRIDGE



1969 – METS plan (Freeway plan) – shot down in 1983

1986 – Rossdale Area Redevelopment Plan

2011 - West Rossdale Urban Design Plan approval

2015 - High-level **River Crossing** vision approved by City Council

2019 - River Crossing Business Plan and Heritage Interpretive Plan approved by City Council

2021 - Area Redevelopment Plan amendment

2021 - Rossdale Transportation Network planning and design begins






River Crossing Business Plan Vision



- The vision of the River
 Crossing Business Plan is to transform the central river valley into a vibrant community and special gathering space.
- The plan calls for an interpretive park, new residential developments,
 Touch the Water Promenade and a restoration of the Rossdale Power Plant and Transportation needs for future uses.



River Crossing Business Plan Direction








Bellamy Hill Road and Rossdale Road North
















Rossdale Road Rehabilitation Project



- Add a shared use path
- Rossdale Road will be reduced from two lanes to one lane (north/east bound)
- An existing segment of Rossdale Road will be closed (south/west bound)
- New traffic signal at 99 Avenue and Bellamy Hill Road







Next Steps

- Land Development and Transportation Implementation concurrently
- Rossdale Road Rehabilitation Reconstruction
- Secure the funding for Phase 1
- Planning and Design of Park and Power Plant
